Camrose Composite High School	Cabinetry and Millwork Program Implementation	Purchase a Mini-Max commercial hot-air edge bender and Blum mini-press and assorted hand tools in order to establish new Cabinetry and Millworking courses. Carmangay Outreach	Introduction to the Trades	Students in grades 8 - 12 will build 2-3 storage sheds in order to gain an introduction into construction skills (framing, wiring, shingling, siding, sheeting and exterior finishing).
