GENERAL DESCRIPTION

A machinist uses machine tools to manufacture parts from raw material for a variety of industries. Nearly all consumer goods have been machined or are manufactured from tools or equipment which has been manufactured by a machinist.

Purpose of the Challenge:

Assess the competitor's precision machining skills and trade knowledge through theory and practical testing.

Skills and Knowledge to be Tested:

The competition will occur over two days (12 hours of competition). On the first day of competition there will be a 1 hour professional consultation followed by 3 hours of machining and 1 hour theory exam. The second day there will be 3 hours of machining and 1 hour theory exam. The machining section of the contest involves machining projects using a conventional engine lathe and a conventional vertical milling machine.

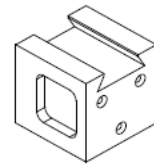
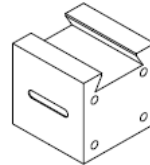
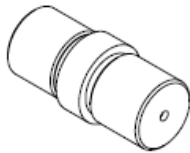
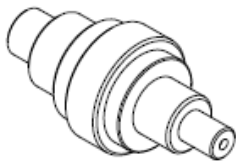
Conventional Engine Lathe

EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

Equipment and Materials Competitors Must Supply:

- CSA Approved Safety Glasses and
- CSA Approved Steel Toed Footwear
- Shop coat (coveralls)
- Ear Plugs
- Competitors are required to follow all industry safety standards during the competition

***Competitors will not be allowed into the competition area without the required safety equipment.**
