GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Purpose of Challenge:

To enable competitors to demonstrate their knowledge & skill of welding principles. The competition will consist of a practical examination. Competitors will be expected to utilize their practical skills & knowledge in drawing interpretation of fitting, and welding. The following processes are applicable: SMAW & GMAW. Safety procedures will also be evaluated.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Skills and Knowledge to be Tested:

The regional skills competitors should be prepared to apply their theory knowledge in a layout and drawing interpretation to complete a 5 hour practical project which may include but not limited to the following tasks:

- SMAW 1G,3G Butt Weld
- GMAW 1G,3G Butt Weld
- SMAW GMAW, 2F & 3F Welds

EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

Equipment and Materials Competitors Must Supply:

- Work Boots (CSA Approved steel toe work boots)
- Side shields required for prescription glasses
- Welding Helmet
- Welding Gloves
- Cutting Goggles # 4 or # 5 lens
- Appropriate clothing (100% cotton coveralls recommended)
- Long sleeve denim shirt or jacket, 100% cotton
- Safety Glasses

Competitor tools will be limited to the following:

- Pipe liner files
- Wire brush
- Vice grips/pliers
- Magnets
- Tri square
- Imperial/metric tape measure
- Centre punch
- Tip cleaners
- Hammer
- Cold chisel
- Soap stone

*Competitors are required to follow all industry standards during the competition.
