

## Process for Competitors advancing on to Team Alberta to participate at the 2016 Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC)

### 1.0 Secondary - Regionalized event areas:

The following event areas will be included in an individual lottery draw as noted below:

- *Auto Service*
  - *Baking*
  - *Cabinet Making*
  - *Carpentry*
  - *Culinary Arts*
  - *TV & Video Production*
  - *Welding*
- a. The gold medal winners from each of the events that are hosted at Regional Skills Canada Competitions (RSCC) will be entered into each individual event draw. All names will be drawn and their chronological order recorded (1, 2, 3, etc.) until all names are drawn. The complete draw list will be posted by photo evidence on the Skills Alberta website. The first entry selected in the lottery will be offered a spot on Team Alberta.
  - b. The entry that is selected will belong to the competitor, not the school. Should that particular competitor decline their spot, the next chronologically selected entry will be offered the spot. This process will repeat itself until the spot on Team Alberta has been accepted.
  - c. Should all gold medalists decline a spot on Team Alberta, a second lottery will be completed using each RSCC's silver medal placements.
  - d. All secondary competitors advancing to the SCNC must meet the eligibility requirements stated in the "Regional and Provincial Skills Canada Competition Policies" document, section 5.0. A copy can be found here:

All names will be drawn and their chronological order recorded (1, 2, 3, etc.) until all names are drawn. The complete draw list will be posted by photo evidence on the Skills Alberta website. The first entry selected in the lottery will be offered a spot on Team Alberta.
- b. The entry that is selected will belong to the competitor, not the school. Should that particular competitor decline their spot, the next chronologically selected entry will be offered the spot. This process will repeat itself until the spot on Team Alberta has been accepted.

### 1.2 Post-Secondary event areas:

A limited amount of post-secondary events have been re-located to various venues for a modified 1 day competition. The gold medalist from each modified competition will be offered a spot on Team Alberta. For more information regarding which events are being hosted, please visit:

**For events that are being re-located and hosted, please note the following:**

- a. The Team Alberta spot that is awarded belongs to the competitor, not the school. Should that particular competitor decline their spot, the next highest ranking competitor will be offered the spot. This process will repeat itself until the spot on Team Alberta has been accepted.
- b. All post-secondary competitors advancing to the Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC) must meet the eligibility requirements stated in the “Regional and Provincial Skills Canada Competition Policies” document, section 5.0. A copy can be found here:

**For events that do advance to SCNC but are not being re-located or hosted, the process for competitor selection is as follows:**

- a. Previous results will be considered for competitors who participated at the post-secondary level of competition at the 2015 Provincial Skills Canada Competition (PSCC) and who are also registered to compete in the same event area at the 2016 PSCC. The individual who received the highest medal ranking – Gold (1<sup>st</sup>), Silver (2<sup>nd</sup>) or Bronze (3<sup>rd</sup>) – will be offered a spot on Team Alberta.
- b. If there are no returning competitors in an event area, the competitors from the 2016 Provincial registration list will be entered into each individual event draw. All names will be drawn and their chronological order recorded (1, 2, 3, etc.) until all names are drawn. The complete draw list will be posted by photo evidence on the Skills Alberta website. The first entry selected in the lottery will be offered a spot on Team Alberta.
- c. The entry that is selected will belong to the competitor, not the school. Should that particular competitor decline their spot, the next chronologically selected entry will be offered the spot. This process will repeat itself until the spot on Team Alberta has been accepted.
