<p>COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL, AT A POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTION) Competitors will compete individually, in person, from their local Post-Secondary Institution. Location specific COVID-19 protocols must be followed. Post-Secondary Institutions and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. This competition will be closed to the public. Only registered competitors and assigned Provincial Technical Committee members will be allowed to attend.</p> <p>COMPETITION ORIENTATION: The competition will begin with a virtual orientation. Competitors will join the assigned videoconference link that will be emailed to all registered competitors for the competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.</p> <p>LIVESTREAMED COMPETITION: Competitors must film their competition throughout the entire day. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera, as well as mics working. Competitors must consider their camera angle and lighting in advance of the competition. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they are prepared for a day long livestream.</p>

PURPOSE OF THE CHALLENGE

The principal function of an aesthetician is to give beauty care to persons with the main purpose of improving their appearance as well as giving the people a physical and psychological well-being. By general means, the essential part of this work is to treat different parts of the body including specific care to facial skin, specific care for the hands, specific care of the body, and the application of makeup, while demonstrating professionalism and complying with occupational health and safety.

Tasks that will be performed during the contest: (Judged live by Competition Facilitator)

- **Case Study and smokey eye makeup:** The competitor will be given the characteristics of a client's skin and come up with a treatment plan and a home regime. Review the case study and fill in the provided paper work to make decisions on the treatment plan and home care regime for the client. Use the appropriate make-up and blending techniques to create a smokey eye with winged liner application and of strip lashes and brow shaping. (Case Study Submitted through jotform link listed above.)
- **Manicure with Nail Art Objectives:** The competitor will demonstrate a manicure using products provided and will duplicate the nail art. Perform a manicure which includes, nail shaping, cuticle work, arm and hand massage, and application of permanent polish. Nail art to be applied according to Test Project posted on Skills Alberta website.⁵
 - Note: Nail art must be free hand using only the nail art brushes and dotter supplied. Decals, polish with built in striper brush, corrector pens, guideline tape, or any other tool will not be allowed. Nail art brushes may not be adjusted in any way.
- **Classic pedicure with red polish:** Perform a basic pedicure which includes cuticle and toenail treatment, callus removal, basic massage, toenail polishing with red polish. (no corrections on polish)⁷
- **Creative Makeup (1980's theme):** The competitor will demonstrate a creative makeup look with a 1980's theme Perform a creative makeup application to the décolleté, and creation of vision board according to the 1980's theme(12x16)

Note: It is the candidate's responsibility to prepare for the competition by becoming familiar with the products and machines to be used/recommended during the competition.

- Manicure/Pedicure:
 - Manicure implements for nail care: only cuticle nippers, nail cutter, nail scissors, buffer, orangewood stick, spatulas, and steel pusher.
 - Disposable Emery board (nail file) for natural nails
 - **Note:** Nails stones are not allowed to push back cuticles
 - Foot bowl
 - Foot file
- Make-up:
 - Makeup brushes (all brushes applicators)
 - Makeup products for creative makeup look
 - False strip eyelashes and glue

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- Makeup sponges
- Scissors for lashes
- Make-up palette to dispense make-up
- Hair clip or headband (for keeping model’s hair secure during make up application)
- Long, black, make up drape for client with no visible logo (to the knee)

 - **Competitors** must bring a copy of the **Contest Description**, Test Project and all other documents pertaining to the Aesthetics competition.
 - Vision board (12” x 16” dimensions only)

Required clothing provided by the competitor

- Uniform (see test project) no leggings or yoga pant styles allowed, all black
- Black non-slip, flat or low heel, closed toed shoes with no laces
- Black socks must be worn
- No jewelry which may interfere with the task being performed or place the model or aesthetician at risk
- Hair must be tidy and tied back, off the collar and face
- Competitor must have short, natural nails. No nail extensions, or recent removal of. No nail varnish or coverings.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Point breakdown /100

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TIE BREAKING PROCESS

Tiebreaker #1: In the event of a tie, the candidate with the highest score in the Case Study with Smokey Eye Makeup will be declared the winner.

Tiebreaker #2: In the event of a second tie, the competitor with the highest score in the Manicure with Nail Art criteria will be declared the winner.

Tiebreaker #3: If a tie still remains, the competitor with the highest score in the Creative Makeup criteria will be declared the winner.
