COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL, AT A POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTION)			

Competitors will compete individually, in person, from their local Post-Secondary Institution. Location specific COVID-19 protocols must be followed. Post-Secondary Institutions and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. This competition will be closed to the public. Only registered competitors and assigned Provincial Technical Committee members will be allowed to attend.

COMPETITION ORIENTATION: The competition will begin with a virtual orientation. Competitors will join the assigned videoconference link that will be emailed to all registered competitors for the competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.

- Multiple files can be uploaded at once, each file has a maximum size of 1G. If file sizes are larger than 1G, please follow alternate instructions through the submission link.

ACCEPTED FILE TYPE: pdf, doc, docx, xls, xlsx, csv, txt, rtf, html, zip, mp3, wma, mpg, flv, avi, jpg, jpeg, png, gif. If you would like to submit a different type of file, please place it in a zip folder.

To create a zip folder – Select all the files that you would like to submit and right-click your mouse, a menu will open, select Send To, and then click on Compressed (zipped) folder. A zip file will then be created containing your submission documents.

SHIPPING PROJECT FOR JUDGING: Competition Facilitator will be required to ship their finished projects for judging. Skills Canada Alberta will provide packaging and shipping labels.

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Cabinetmaking apprentices born in or after 1999 are eligible to compete in this years Provincial Skills Competition at the Post-Secondary level.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

The project will test the full range of skills needed by a competent Cabinetmaker.

- Interpretation of drawings and specifications
- Planning and scheduling of processes
- Safe use of edge cutting hand tools such as chisels and hand planes
- Accurate measuring and mark out
- Safe use of woodworking machinery such as: table saw, miter saw, router table, drills, biscuit joiner
- Proper gluing techniques
- Final surface preparation before finishing
- Using critical thinking to solve construction problems

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This year's project is a Tool Tote that competitors will be able to use for years to come! The project includes various different skill elements such as:

- Case with keyed mitred corner joinery and integrated tongue and groove construction
- Cutting and shaping of curves
- Hand cut dovetail joinery

The project combines the use of sheet goods and solid hardwoods. Planning, layout, cutting and machining of interlocking joinery, assembly techniques and final surface preparation will all play a part in achieving a successful outcome.

Please note that the project drawings posted may be changed up to 30% for the actual competition. Changes would not be major but make sure you are referencing the correct drawings when it comes time for the competition!

EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

A materials package for the competition project will be available at the institution for the competition. The material package will contain:

- all the project material required for the project as well as a materials checklist
- sealed competition project drawings
- marking rubric and photo submission instructions

The materials package may be opened and the checklist items confirmed but the sealed project drawings are to be opened the morning of the competition.

Any and all conventional hand tools commonly found in a cabinetmaker's tool box may be supplied by a competitor. No pre-made, project specific jigs or fixtures may be used in the competition. No commercial jigs or fixtures may be used for cutting dovetails. *Dovetail layout markers are allowed*.

Due to the unique circumstances of this year's competition, competitors will be using the machinery available at their competition site at the discretion of the supervising parties.

Certain machinery (provided by the institute) should be available for the competitor(s) to set up and use, including:

Sundry supplies such as glue, sandpaper, screws, pin nails, masking tape etc. should also be available by the institute.

JUDGING CRITERIA

The project elements will be marked according to the following guidelines:

Overall Dimensions	10%
Detail Dimensions	15%
Case Joinery and Assembly	30%
Drawer Joinery and Assembly	25%
Surface Preparation	20%

*Weighting of elements may deviate slightly on actual marking rubric

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

The first tie breaker will be the quality of the dovetails after assembly. Second tie breaker will be the quality of the case mitres. Third tie breaker will be the function of the drawer. Other Joinery elements will be used as tie breakers as required.

CONTEST AREA SPECIFIC SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

Competitors are required to supply and wear CSA approved steel toed footwear and CSA approved safety glasses.

Policies and procedures in place at the competition site regarding safety and COVID19 should be followed throughout the competition.







CLOTHING REQUIREMENT

Appropriate work clothing must be worn to compete. All clothing must be neat and clean, and free of rips and tears. Casual wear such as shorts and open toed shoes/sandals will not be permitted. No loose-fitting clothes or jewelry.
