2021 PROVINCIAL SKILLS CANADA COMPETITION Skills Canada Alberta

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

This competition will test the competitor's ability to install and manage servers and clients on a Network, including Windows and Linux Systems along with Cisco devices in a network environment. It will occur in two parts, and competitors will work individually on each, although the competition will be considered "open book" meaning competitors may search for solutions online, but should not be discussing with others solutions or asking for help.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

Competitors will be setting up their systems and network environment in a virtualized network environment (Hyper-V) hosted by Microsoft Azure Labs. Connectivity to this environment and introduction to working in Hyper-V will be introduced in the system orientation for those that require it.

- The virtual network will involve Windows clients, servers and Linux operating systems carrying out standard network services like DNS, DHCP, and Active Directory.
- Networking activities will all be done using Packet Tracer software to design and creating virtual Networks. This will involve the use of Cisco routers and switches through a CCNA level of knowledge.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- Install and configure various operating systems (see supplied software for versions) in a virtual environment.
- Using Packet Tracer to virtualize Cisco device configuration.
- Install and configure Active Directory on Windows server for user and group management.
- Configure networking services on a Linux machine installation of services may have to happen off of the DVD/iso file, rather than the Internet.
- Understand routing concepts and how they are implemented on Cisco routers.
- Configuration of a Cisco router and switch from the command interface.
- Perform basic network administration and security.
- Understand switching concepts such as VLANs, Spanning Tree, and Ethernet port characteristics.
- Understanding of TCP/IP and ability to perform subnet calculations, and assign addresses, including variable length subnetting.
- Properly record system documentation.
- Time management.
