COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/ IN SCHOOL) <p>All secondary competitors will be competing with in their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school's Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day.</p> <p>Each competitor must have a teacher/supervisor available throughout the day, in case of incident. (Teacher/Supervisor must be present at the competition orientation.)</p> <p>Competitors and Teachers should be prepared to receive additional information about the competition projects, livestreams, shipping, etc. prior to the competition. Please ensure you are double checking for emails from Skills, including checking junk mail.</p> <p>WEBEX LIVESTREAMS: Competition Registration and Orientation: The competition will begin with a mandatory virtual registration. Competitors will join the assigned link that will be emailed to all registered competitors and registering teachers in advance. This will be the time that competitors are able to check in and ensure sound, cameras, and tech are working appropriately. The registration will be followed by competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.</p>

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

To provide an opportunity for students to demonstrate their ability to design a dynamic and aesthetically pleasing website.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- Ability to develop web pages / a web site on a fictional scenario that is outlined below.
- Some features that competitors may choose to include on their web pages are: menus, graphics, forms, tables, styles, meta tags, and links.
- The majority of the site theme needs to be built using HTML5. Presentation formatting should be done with CSS. Basic JavaScript i.e. form validation is highly recommended.
- A proper planning process must be presented on paper (storyboard / flowchart).
- Websites should be functional and visually pleasing in various screen resolutions.
- Site should be easy to maintain and user friendly.
- Cross browser compatibility between latest versions of Firefox, Chrome, and Edge.
- All final project media must be uploaded to the server via an FTP client for testing and grading. (FTP instructions will be given but it is encouraged that students practice / have a general knowledge of this technology beforehand) Please ensure your BYOD has the appropriate client, i.e. FileZilla, for your upload method. Troubleshooting help will be given for FTP.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The student is to take the perspective of developing a site for a customer. These are the pages the customer requires:

- Home / Splash page
- Store Front with Reviews / Testimonials



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- Customer Support / Request for Information
- About Us

All of the information on the site must be tied together using a menu and web design. A number of images, text content and products from the customer will be provided. The website will be for one of the following companies below, the specific project details will identify which company it actually is on the date of the competition.

- Clothing Retailer
- Used Car Sales
- Office Space Rental
- 3D Modeler Offering Services / Printing

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The event will be such that the server you are building your website on, will also count as your submission. FTP access will be turned off promptly at 4pm on the last day of the competition so ensure your website is fully posted and running as you expected it to run.

To help with this submission we advise posting your website a few different times / day to test and to make sure your website is functioning as you intended.

EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

Skills Canada Alberta Provided Tools, Materials, and Equipment

Server (Linux OS) which the websites will be posted to using FTP, the server will be running software to support:

- PHP 8.1
- MySQL 8
- phpMyAdmin
- FTP server
- NGINX

Competitors will receive an email in advance of the competition with instructions on how to access the server.

Computer / workstation with relevant software installed to help them create the website / graphics they need.
