To test the knowledge and skills of each competitor in the areas of: blueprint reading, fluid power (pneumatics) ISO schematics, precision hand layout, precisionfitting skills, use of hand tools, hand drills etc., install mechanical components, MIGwelding and fabrication, predictive maintenance and laser shaft alignment (Fixturlaser SMC & NXA Pro).

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

Welding, alignment, hand tool operation, layout operation, knowledge of imperialand ANSI measuring.

TASKS THAT MAY BE PERFORMED DURING THE CONTEST

- Perform hand tool operations
- Perform precision hand layout operations
- Read and interpret blueprints
- Install supplied pneumatic components and build the required circuit as pergiven instruction
- Perform Predictive Maintenance tasks and a Laser Shaft Alignment including Thermal Growth Offset
- Knowledge of Imperial measurement and ANSI symbols
- ISO Fluid Power (pneumatic) schematic drawings standards

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

- Tiebreaker #1: Competitor with highest score in laser alignment will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #2: If second tie occurs the competitor with the highest score inwelding portion will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #3: If third tie occurs the competitor with the highest score in thestainless tube bending will be declared the winner.

Competitors are expected to be dressed in an appropriate manner with their own safety glasses, ear plugs, work boots and coveralls or shop coat. All clothing must be neat and clean and free of rips and tears. Casual wear such as shorts will not be permitted. No loose fitting clothes or jewelry.
