COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/IN SCHOOL)

All secondary competitors will be competing with in their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school's Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day.

Each competitor must have a teacher/ supervisor available throughout the day, in case of incident. (Teacher/Supervisor must be present at the competition orientation.)

Competitors and Teachers should be prepared to receive additional information about the competition projects, livestreams, shipping, etc. prior to the competition. Please ensure you are double checking for emails from Skills, including checking junk mail.

Competition Orientation: The competition will begin with a virtual orientation. Competitors will join the assigned videoconference link that will be emailed to all registered competitors for the competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation. **An email with the WebEx link will be sent out in advance of the competition.**

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Joinery is the process of connecting or joining two or more pieces of wood together using various wood joints. In the timber frame industry joinery is part of the overall strength and construction of bents. In fine woodworking, common forms of joinery include dovetail joints, mortise-and-tenon joints, biscuit joints, lap joints, spline joints, etc. Joiners construct doors, windows, stairs and other architectural objects. Joinery involves work both by hand and machine.

Over the course of 1 day the participants will demonstrate their Joinery abilities in assembling a project. Each participant will receive a set a plans, a work space, materials and related power tools to complete the task.

PLEASE NOTE**

Joinery is currently not an event at the SCNC and therefore the gold medalist of the Secondary Joinery Competition will not become part of Team Alberta and will not compete at the SCNC. Medals will be awarded during the Awards Ceremony.













SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- The ability to hand cut a number of joints such as:
 - o Dovetail
 - Mortise and Tenon
- Hand Plane
- The ability to layout joints to be cut
- The ability to read plans and follow written and verbal instructions
- The ability to work safely and efficiently
- The ability to use the following power tools:
 - o Drill Press
 - Cordless Drill
 - Chisel Mortisers
 - o Miter Saw
 - Router Tables
 - Bandsaws

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

If two or more participants are tied in points at the end of the competition, the following shall apply to determine the placing:

- Step 1. Re-evaluate the effected projects with different judges.
- Step 2. Participant who has completed the project in the least amount of time.
