COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/ IN SCHOOL)

All secondary competitors will be competing with in their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school's Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day.

Each competitor must have a teacher/supervisor available throughout the day, in case of incident. (Teacher/Supervisor must be present at the competition orientation.)

Competitors and Teachers should be prepared to receive additional information about the competition projects, livestreams, shipping, etc. prior to the competition. Please ensure you are double checking for emails from Skills, including checking junk mail.

WEBEX LIVESTREAMS:

Competition Registration and Orientation: The competition will begin with a mandatory virtual registration. Competitors will join the assigned link that will be emailed to all registered competitors and registering teachers in advance. This will be the time that competitors are able to check in and ensure sound, cameras, and tech are working appropriately. The registration will be followed by competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.

To create a zip file – Select all the files that you would like to submit and right-click your mouse, a menu will open, select Send To, and then click on Compressed (zipped) folder. A zip file will then be created containing your submission documents.

Submissions will be due within 15 minutes of the end of competition time. Please note: Late submissions sent after the date and time specified above will not be accepted.

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Give competitors the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge and challenge their skills in computer and network support functions.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

- Secondary competitors will be identifying components of a computer and making recommendations for upgrading parts.
- Competitors will be expected to setup and do specific configurations of Windows 10 machines in a home or small business scenario.









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- Competitors will complete help tickets on Windows 10 computers on a home network and build a network in a virtual environment using Packet Tracer software. Networking tasks at the secondary level will assume the use of a (virtual) Linksys wireless router.
- Cybersecurity activities will involve a written component and a practical component done within a Linux shell environment.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- Computer hardware identification and recommendations.
- Troubleshoot and document configuration and networking issues
- Configure and troubleshoot Windows 10
- Configure Linux in a command line environment
- Perform basic network administration tasks.
- Use packet tracer software to troubleshoot and configure a virtual network environment.
- Understand basic switch configurations using Cisco IOS.
- Understand basic routing and be able to set up and configure a (virtual) Linksys broadband router to manage a small home-based network and connect it to the Internet.
- Properly setup and secure network shares.
- Understanding of TCP/IP and ability to perform basic IPv4 subnet calculations and assign addresses.
- Understand IPv6 configuration
- Properly record system documentation.
- Time management.
- Understanding of general cybersecurity topics including common cybersecurity threats (i.e. phishing, malware, etc.), and common security practices (i.e. encryption, firewalls, etc.) to perform in a simulated incident and written component.

All competitors must always exhibit workplace safety procedures and conduct themselves professionally.

JUDGING CRITERIA

- Omitting specifics, competition description will include marking of all elements.
- Competitor's ability to upgrade and properly configure PC workstation.
- Proper installation of operating system and application software.
- Safely utilize trade tools and display of proper methodology.
- Neatness of work area and space management.









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- Neat and proper documentation of PC inventory and configuration settings.
- In the case of a tie at the end of the competition, the winner will be determined by the highest score on the troubleshooting section will be the winner, if still tied, the highest score on the Windows Networking section will determine the winner, if still tied, the highest score on the Packet Tracer section will determine the winner, committee, if still tied, the highest score on the Hardware section will determine the winner.
