COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/ IN SCHOOL)

All secondary competitors will be competing within their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school's Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day. Project materials will be supplied and shipped to your school prior to your competition.

Competitors will join the assigned videoconference link that will be emailed to all registered competitors. Competitors will need to position their camera in such a way that the judges can see their entire work area from an exterior view (exterior view of the welding booth). Competitors will be expected to have their camera on for the duration of the competition.

Once a competitor has completed their assigned project by the specified competition completion time (no additional time will be permitted), competitors must submit five photographs of their project WITHIN 15 MINUTES (by 3:45 p.m.) of the contest concluding. For the photos, please submit:

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

To enable competitors to demonstrate their knowledge & skill of welding principles. The competition will consist of a practical examination. Competitors will be expected to utilize their practical skills & knowledge in drawing interpretation of fitting, and welding.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

The provincial skills competitors should be prepared to apply their theory knowledge in a layout and drawing interpretation to complete a 6-hour practical project which may include but not limited to the following tasks (please see the attached project drawing and weld procedures):

Practical Tasks

- Shielded metal arc welding (SMAW, mild steel)
- Gas metal arc welding (GMAW, mild steel)

The following types of joints and positions **may** be included.

SMAW, GMAW

Plate: 1G, 2G, 3G,

Fillet Weld: 1F, 2F, 3F, 4F, 5F Pipe may

or may not be included

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Please see the attached dimensional print and weld processes. Please note that the competition plans may be changed up to 30% on the day of the competition.

Once the project is tacked, No grinding is allowed!

Pictures of the tacked project must be submitted as per the details listed above.













The project shall, at all times be welded 100% on the workbench. (The project must remain flat on the baseplate)

Manual wire brushing may be used on all weld surfaces. (No grinding or filing)

All measurements are in millimeters.
