COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/ IN SCHOOL)

All secondary competitors will be competing within their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school's Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day.

Competitors will need to prepare their competition space with a **FLOORPLAN AREA NOT TO EXCEED 14' x 12'**. All the required tools, equipment, materials, technology and activity needed to complete the competition will be housed in this workspace.

Each competitor must have a teacher/supervisor available throughout the day, in case of incident and / or the potential of one. (Teacher/Supervisor must be present at the competition orientation.)

Competitors and Teachers should be prepared to receive additional information about the competition projects, livestreams, shipping, etc. prior to the competition. Please ensure you are double checking for emails from Skills, including checking junk mail.

WEBEX LIVESTREAMS:

Competition Registration and Orientation: The competition will begin with a mandatory virtual registration. Competitors will join the assigned link that will be emailed to all registered competitors and registering teachers in advance. This will be the time that competitors are able to check in and ensure









sound, cameras, and tech are working appropriately. The registration will be followed by competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.

Competition Livestream: Competitors and their workspace must remain on camera through their entire competition. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera, as well as mics working. Competitors must consider their camera angle and lighting in advance of the competition. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they are prepared for the competition livestream.

PROJECT GRADE SUBMISSION DEADLINE: April 11th by 8:00PM

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Once the competition time runs out, the competitor is to clean the workspace to the teachers satisfaction then leave the area. The teacher(s) will then grade the project as per the grading / evaluation sheet and submit the grade within the allotted time according to the Project Grade Submission process to the link shown below:

ACCEPTED FILE TYPE: pdf, doc, docx, xls, xlsx, csv, txt, rtf, html, zip, mp3, wma, mpg, flv, avi, jpg, jpeg, png, gif. If you would like to submit a different type of file, please place it in a zip folder.

To create a zip file – Select all the files that you would like to submit and right-click your mouse, a menu will open, select Send To, and then click on Compressed (zipped) folder. A zip file will then be created containing your submission documents.

Please note: Late submissions sent after the date and time specified above will not be accepted.

SAFETY:

The health, safety and welfare of all individuals involved with Skills Canada Alberta are of vital importance. Safety is a condition of participation with Skills Canada Alberta and shall not be sacrificed for the sake of expediency. At the discretion of the judges and technical committees, any competitor can be denied the right to participate should they not have the required proper safety equipment and/or act in an unsafe manner that can cause harm to themselves or others.

Competition Safety/Project Orientation: The competition will begin with a virtual orientation. Competitors will join the assigned videoconference link that will be emailed to all registered competitors for the competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.

Safety Checklist: It is the responsibility of each competitor and teacher to review the Safety Checklist in advance of the competition to ensure all safety requirements are met prior to the competition. During the official competition orientation, the Safety Checklist will be formally reviewed with competitors. The Safety Checklist is posted as a separate document with the Contest Description.







Please note: Attendance at Safety/Project orientation is mandatory for all competitors and teacher/supervisors. Competitors not in attendance will not be allowed to participate.

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

If two or more participants are tied in points at the end of the competition, the following tie breaking procedure will be used:

- **Step 1.** Participant with the highest Safety score.
- **Step 2.** Participant who has completed the project in the least amount of time.
- **Step 3.** Participant with the highest Construction score.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENT

Safety protection and appropriate work clothing **must** be worn to compete. Safety protection includes AHS masking as per your school requirements, footwear, hard hat, safety glasses, and hearing protection. All clothing must be neat and clean, and free of rips and tears. Casual wear such as shorts, and open-toed shoes/sandals will not be permitted. No loose-fitting clothes or jewelry. Competitors are required to follow all industry safety standards during the competition.
