COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/ IN SCHOOL)

All secondary competitors will be competing with in their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school's Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day.

Each competitor must have a teacher/supervisor available throughout the day, in case of incident. (Teacher/Supervisor must be present at the competition orientation.) Competitors and Teachers should be prepared to receive additional information about the competition projects, livestreams, shipping, etc. prior to the competition. Please ensure you are double checking for emails from Skills, including checking junk mail.

WEBEX LIVESTREAMS:

Competition Registration and Orientation: The competition will begin with a mandatory virtual registration. Competitors will join the assigned link that will be emailed to all registered competitors and registering teachers in advance. This will be the time that competitors are able to check in and ensure sound, cameras, and tech are working appropriately. The registration will be followed by competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.

Competition Livestream: Competitors must remain on camera through their entire competition. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera, as well as mics working. Competitors must consider their camera angle and lighting in advance of the competition. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure they are prepared for the competition livestream.

The competition also challenges students in hairstyling and promotes this career trade.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- 1. Test 1 Men's Haircut and style from photo 1 hour and 15 minutes
- 2. Test 2 Ladies Long Hair Special Occasion from photo and reveled request 1 hour and 15 minutes



3. Test 3 - Ladies Cut, Color and Style from inspiration pallet and reveled request – 2 hours and 30 minutes

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The level of this competition will allow the young stylists to demonstrate their technical skills and creative ability in the following areas:

- 1. Haircutting scissors, razor, textures, and clippers.
- 2. Hairstyling setting & blow-drying
- 3. Long Hair Design
- 4. Creative Cosmetology/Ornamentation
- 5. Hair Coloring and De-Coloration semi-permanent and permanent.
- 6. Competition Styling

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to livestreaming the video, students will be required to send in photos of their finished style suitable for posting to a social media account. Photos must represent front of style, back of style, and both left and right views. Submission details will be given to students during orientation.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Test specific criteria is listed below.

Test 1 – MEN'S HAIRCUT and STYLE from Photo

1hours 15 minutes

The mannequin for this test is Cole

RATIONALE

Competitors will receive 3 photos. One photo will be chosen at the end of the orientation and students may take the photo out of their envelope and immediately start the competition from time photo has been shown. Photo must be reproduced.

Video requirements

- Stylist must remain in the video view for the duration
- Once time has been called stylist must show a close-up video in a circular motion of their finished project as explained in the orientation.
- Any outside communication from teachers or other students, verbal or otherwise with the
 competitor during the competition times will be seen as coaching and will cause demerits to be
 awarded and possible elimination from competition.
- Mannequins are considered to represent live customers and should be treated as such. Do not
 fasten with pins or glue etc. Using unrealistic and unprofessional means to secure hair or
 ornamentation will result in demerits.

HAIRCUT

The mannequin must be unwashed and unaltered from shipping condition.

- The specific view of photo must be reproduced and the remaining elements of the haircut are to be determined by the stylist.
- Clippers and trimmers are allowed, but guards are not.
- Straight razor must have a guard.
- Brushes and/or combs and clips are permitted.
- All styling products are allowed (except colored sprays, colored mousse, colored gels, colored markers, crayons etc. cannot be used).



Test 2 - Ladies Long Hair from Photo and Reveled Request

TIME

1hour 15 minutes

The mannequin for this test is Sophia

RATIONALE

This test represents a typically occurrence in the salon. The client comes in with a picture and an additional request. The photo and request will be determined by an independent panel of Alberta Hairstylists and will remain in a sealed envelope until the orientation of the competition. The finished style will reflect a commercial look.

The mannequin must be unwashed and unaltered from shipping condition at the start of the competition.



Video requirements

- Stylist must remain in the video view for the duration.
- Once time has been called stylist must show a close-up video in a circular motion of their finished project as explained in the orientation.
 - Any outside communication from teachers or other students, verbal or otherwise with the competitor during the competition times will be seen as coaching and will cause demerits to be awarded and possible elimination from competition.
 - Mannequins are considered to represent live customers and should be treated as such. Do not
 fasten with pins or glue etc. Using unrealistic and unprofessional means to secure hair or
 ornamentation will result in demerits.

COLOUR

• In this test you are not allowed to use any color.

FINISHED RESULT

- Free choice of professional tools allowed. (Industry acceptable)
- No cutting implements or tweezers are allowed.
- Hair fillers, padding or extensions are not allowed.
- Hair netting is not allowed.
- Colored sprays (including glitter), colored mousse, colored gels, colored markers, crayons etc. cannot be used.
- The hair is not to be cut.
- No dressing of the mannequin allowed.
- No penetrating pins into the head. Only use techniques you would use on a client to secure the hair or ornamentation. (See authentic Practice at the end of test 4)

Photo Submission

Mannequin must remain untouched from competition completion. If the mannequin has been altered from what was submitted during competition the competitor will earn 0 pts and be issued demerits.

Stylist must upload 6 pictures of their finished project. With the exception of the 6th photo, all photos must be close range, taken straight on (not above or below subject) with no filter.

Test 3 - Ladies Cut, Color and Style from Inspiration Pallet and Reveled Request -

Time: 2 hours 30 minutes

The mannequin used for this test is Sophia.

Video requirements

- Stylist must remain in the video view for the duration. This includes areas of color selection, mixing, and takedown.
- Once time has been called stylist must show a close-up video in a circular motion of their finished project as explained in the orientation.





- Any outside communication from teachers or other students, verbal or otherwise with the
 competitor during the competition times will be seen as coaching and will cause demerits to be
 awarded and possible elimination from competition.
- Mannequins are considered to represent live customers and should be treated as such. Do not
 fasten with pins or glue etc. Using unrealistic and unprofessional means to secure hair or
 ornamentation will result in demerits.

RATIONALE

Competitors will receive 6 photos, 3 of color inspiration and 3 of haircut duplication. One photo will be chosen at the end of the orientation and students may take the photo out of their envelope and immediately start the competition from time photo has been shown. Photo color inspiration and haircut style is to be reproduced as if a client brought in the photo.

This haircut and color must reflect a commercial haircut color and style typically performed in a salon. The inspirational pallet for color choice and incorporation WILL be from one of the 3 options provided. The options are meant to guide the stylist, and stylists are discouraged to attempt to duplicate the color represented, the photo is the color inspiration only. The selection of the color inspiration will happen during orientation as will the haircut that must be duplicated, the color inspiration but the target (as a client would request in a salon atmosphere). The 6-color inspiration and haircut requirement will remain in a sealed envelope until the orientation for the competition, which at that time will be revealed. Once revealed by the PTC Chair, the competitors may not confer with anyone. This test must respect industry standards.

This mannequin was used in test 2 and therefore can be washed and in a wet or dried state prior to the start of the competition time. No precutting or coloring must occur. Prepping of the mannequin MUST be done by the student only.

HAIRCUT

- The selected request must be present and visible.
- All cutting techniques and tools are allowed.

COLOUR

- Commercial and wearable by a majority not a rare few.
- All coloring techniques are allowed.
- All color products are allowed to be used in this test with the exception of colored sprays (including glitter), colored mousse, colored gels, colored markers, crayons etc. cannot be used.
- The selected inspiration color pallet must be present, visible and prominent. All hair must be colored.
- All hair must have a noticeable change of color

Stylist must up load 4 pictures of their finished project. With the exception of the 5th photo, all photos must be close range, taken straight on (not above or below subject) with no filter.

DEMERITS FOR EACH TEST

Demerits will be charged during each test area for each infraction. Demerits will also be given for Authentic Practice, Sustainability, and Safety Infractions.

Demerits may include but are not limited to:

- Failure to covered labels on any product being used.
- Failure to cleaning out sink immediately after use.
- Not remaining in video view
- No touching the hair after the time has been called.
- Any communication verbal or otherwise between competitor, teacher and classmates.
- Unprofessional conduct

Authentic Practice: All competitors will treat their mannequin as they would a client. This includes but is not limited to:

- At the sink.
- When applying color or chemical
- When securing hair or ornamentation
- While styling
- When transporting from one area to another.

Sustainability

- Excess color waste
- Excess shampoo/conditioner
- Excessive product waste





Safety

- Failure to sweep up hair immediately after cutting.
- Professional sanitary practices must be followed.
- Industry safety protocols must be followed.
- Socks or hosiery must be worn.
- All SDS sheets must be available if requested.

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

Tiebreaker #1: The competitor with the highest score in test 3

Tiebreaker #2: The competitor with the highest score in test 1.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENT

Appropriate work clothing must be worn to compete. All clothing must be neat and clean, and free of rips and tears. Casual wear such as shorts and open toed shoes/sandals will not be permitted. No loose-fitting clothes or jewelry.
