<p>COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/ IN SCHOOL) All secondary competitors will be competing with in their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school’s Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day.</p> <p>Each competitor must have a teacher/supervisor available throughout the day, in case of incident (Teacher/Supervisor must be present at the competition orientation).</p> <p>Competitors and Teachers should be prepared to receive additional information about the competition projects, livestreams, shipping, etc. prior to the competition. Please ensure you are double checking for emails from Skills, including checking junk mail.</p> <p>WEBEX LIVESTREAMS: Competition Registration and Orientation: The competition will begin with a mandatory virtual registration. Competitors will join the assigned link that will be emailed to all registered competitors and registering teachers in advance. This will be the time that competitors are able to check in and ensure sound, cameras, and tech are working appropriately. Registration will be followed by competition orientation. Camera’s MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.</p> <p>The WebEx link will remain open throughout the day with a judge online. You do NOT need to have your camera on, it is advised that competitors stay on the WebEx throughout the competition.</p>

- Multiple files can be uploaded at once, each file has a maximum size of 1G. If file sizes are larger than 1G, please follow alternate instructions through the submission link.

ACCEPTED FILE TYPE: pdf, doc, docx, xls, xlsx, csv, txt, rtf, html, zip, mp3, wma, mpg, flv, avi, jpg, jpeg, png, gif. If you would like to submit a different type of file, please place it in a zip folder.

To create a zip file – Select all the files that you would like to submit and right-click your mouse, a menu will open, select Send To, and then click on Compressed (zipped) folder. A zip file will then be created containing your submission documents.

Submissions will be due within 15 minutes of the end of competition time. Please note: Late submissions sent after the date and time specified above will not be accepted.

SAFETY:

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Purpose of the Challenge is to produce a total of 11 photographs over the course of the competition.

- 6 hours will be allocated to photograph and postproduction. You are only allowed to use an image once.
- Pictures must be submitted as jpgs.
- Incorrect images will be disqualified, and all judges' decisions are final.
- Images that fail to meet the criteria and or circumvent the spirit and intent of the competition will be disqualified.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- **Composition**—eg: visual elements, style, balance and harmony, framing, DoF

- **Technical** –eg: focus, exposure, contrast, use of light, tonal range
- **Impact** –eg: overall impression of the photograph, tells a story, the emotion, meaning
- **Respect** of the theme or collection
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PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Part 1: Mystery Object 1 – Due End of Competition Day (1 image)

- The photographer will be challenged to create a photograph with no preparation or foreknowledge of the subject.
- One (1) mystery object will be identified to each photography competitor at the beginning of our competition.
- The photograph must use the mystery object as the subject, or it must be a major contributing element to the subject.
- The photograph must be taken during competition hours.
- The final photograph must be submitted as a JPEG.
- Photographs must be named as follows: lastname_part1_01.jpg
- Preparation:
 - Proficiency in shooting under a specific timeline

Part 2: In Camera, No Editing – Due End of Competition Day (3 images)

- 3 unique photographs of 3 different subjects.
- Images are required to be submitted in JPEG format.
- Editing, cropping, in camera effects, or postproduction CANNOT be used on these 3 photographs.
- Images are to be shot in camera and submitted without alternation.
- Each photograph will be graded on its own merits.
- Photographs must be named as follows: lastname_part2_01, lastname_part2_02, lastname_part2_03
- Preparation:
 - Shooting in manual mode
 - The photographer shall utilize the histogram in creating a properly exposed image.
 - How to use Custom White Balance

Part 3: Guided Composite – Due end of Competition Day (1 Image)

- The photographer will be required to create a composite photograph from a common set of supplied images from the Provincial Technical Committee (PTC).
- The supplied images will be identical for all competitors at the start of Competition Day.
- There will be some mandatory images (labelled) and some optional images (also labelled).
- The supplied images will be in JPEG format.
- Students must consider file types and size of each supplied image.
- Each photographer will build a unique composite image.

- The final composite photograph must be submitted as a JPEG. The final composite photograph must be named as follows: lastname_part3_guidedcomposite.jpg
- Preparation:
 - Students are proficient at using photoshop layers, masking, and colour correction.

Part 4: Personal Project – Due at the START of Competition Day by 8:00 AM (3 Images)

- The photographer will be required to create a series of 3 thematically related photographs.
THEME: Explore
- This 3-image series will be viewed, judged, and marked as a collective. There will be one mark for this series of images.
- All images must be the same ratio and orientation (i.e., all horizontal or vertical and the same pixel dimensions).
- Each photograph must be labeled with the theme and title in a corner of the photographic competitors choosing (Find the least intrusive corner for this).
- Be aware that the photos will be arranged for judging, from left to right, in the order that they are numbered.
- Each of the final photographs must be submitted as a JPEG.
- Photographs must be named as follows: lastname_part4_01.jpg, lastname_part4_02.jpg and lastname_part4_03.jpg

Part 5: Mystery Song – Due End of Competition Day (3 Images)

- The photographer will be challenged to create a series of three photographs from a song chosen by the competitor and approved by their school supervisor before the competition starts, to successfully translate the mood/message of the music into a series of 3 visual images.
- This 3-image series will be viewed, judged, and marked as a collective. There will be one mark for this series of images.
- All images must be the same ratio and orientation (i.e., all horizontal or vertical and the same pixel dimensions).
- Each photograph must be labeled with the song title in a corner of the photographic competitors choosing (Find the least intrusive corner for this).
- The song must be school appropriate and not contain any swears or reference anything sexual.
- The photographs must be taken during competition hours.
- The final photographs must be submitted as a JPEG.
- Photographs must be named as follows: lastname_part5_01.jpg, lastname_part5_02.jpg, lastname_part5_03.jpg
- The song used must also be submitted.

Part 6: Entire Portfolio

- The entire body of work will be reviewed for the quality, style, consistency, and strength of images.

- Each photographic competitor's images (11 total) will be displayed on 1 screen at 1 time and be judged as a body of work.

Tiebreaker #3: The competitor with the highest score in the In Camera, no Editing criteria will be declared the winner.
