COMPETITION FORMAT: (VIRTUAL/ IN SCHOOL)

All secondary competitors will be competing with in their school environment and must arrange in advance with a teacher for a safe competition location, according to their school's Covid-19 safety policies. They will need to prepare their competition space with all of the required tools, equipment, materials, and technology (as listed below) that will be needed to complete the competition. Teachers and competitors will need to work together to ensure the competitor is ready for success on their competition day.

Each competitor must have a teacher/ supervisor available throughout the day, in case of incident. (Teacher/Supervisor must be present at the competition orientation.)

Competitors and Teachers should be prepared to receive additional information about the competition projects, livestreams, shipping, etc. prior to the competition. Please ensure you are double checking for emails from Skills, including checking junk mail.

WEBEX LIVESTREAMS:

Tech Check: A "Tech Check" will take place prior to the competition with the purpose of giving the competitor an opportunity to ensure they have all of the necessary technology in place to join in their virtual orientation meeting the morning of their competition. On the competition day, there will be no time to work out technology issues. This is the opportunity work out any unforeseen issues and to start your competition day off prepared. There may also be an opportunity to ask questions regarding the competition day if time allows. An email with the WebEx link will be sent out in advance of the competition.





Competition Orientation: The competition will begin with a virtual orientation. Competitors will join the assigned videoconference link that will be emailed to all registered competitors for the competition orientation. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera during the orientation.

Live Streamed Competition: Competitors must film their entire competition. Camera's MUST be on and competitors visible on the camera, as well as mics working. Competitors must consider their camera angle and lighting in advance of the competition. It is the competitors responsibility to ensure they are prepared for the competition livestream.

To create a zip file – Select all the files that you would like to submit and right-click your mouse, a menu will open, select Send To, and then click on Compressed (zipped) folder. A zip file will then be created containing your submission documents.

Submissions will be due within 15 minutes of the end of competition time. Please note: Late submissions sent after the date and time specified above will not be accepted.

SAFETY:

The health, safety and welfare of all individuals involved with Skills Canada Alberta are of vital importance. Safety is a condition of participation with Skills Canada Alberta and shall not be sacrificed for the sake of expediency. At the discretion of the judges and technical committees, any competitor can be denied the right to participate should they not have the required proper safety equipment and/or act in an unsafe manner that can cause harm to themselves or others.

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Enable industry, as well as observers, to view the level of skill taught within the secondary and postsecondary programs and encourage interaction between the various sectors. This relationship will ensure the skills gained by young hairstylists at all levels of training meet the demands of the beauty industry. The competition also challenges students in hairstyling and promotes this career area.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

The level of this competition will allow the young stylists to demonstrate their technical skills and creative design ability in the following test by creating a Creative Bridal Style (Long Hair) Evening. **75% of the finished hairstyle will be in an up-style not touching or below the shoulders (or where shoulders would be).**

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Ladies Hairstyling Creative Bridal Style Start Time: 9:30 a.m. Orientation 10:00 a.m. Competition

Duration: 1.5 Hours

Test: Creative Bridal Style: Must be Commercial and Wearable

Long hair must be combed into an up style showing a bridal theme. A light fringe or bang may be incorporated if the hair is layered. **No temporary color** including but not limited to chalks, glitter, and mascara.

Objective:

- The competitor will create an up-style that incorporates a bridal theme which best demonstrates their artistic ability. The style should be acceptable for a majority not a few.
- The competitors will handle hair confidently, brush, comb, and part hair correctly to create an up style that is cohesive to a bridal theme.
- **75% of the finished hairstyle will be in an up-style** not touching or below the shoulders (or where shoulders would be).
- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- No curls, waves or shapes can be incorporated prior to the start of competition.
- Must incorporate two different textures in the design.

Ornamentation:

- Ornamentation **must** be used and compliments design
- Ornamentation does not cover more than 1/3 of the head
- Ornamentation demonstrates pre-planning & creativity





SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the live competition video, students will be required to send in 4 photos of their finished style suitable for posting to a social media account. Photos must represent front of style, back of style, and both left and right views. Submission details will be given to students during orientation.

Livestream Video requirements

- Volume must remain on for the duration of the competition.
- Stylist must remain in the video view for the duration.

• Once time has been called stylist must show a close-up video in a circular motion of their finished project as explained in the orientation.

Photo Submission

Mannequin must remain untouched from competition completion. If the mannequin has been altered from what was submitted during competition the competitor will earn 0 pts and be issued demerits.

Stylist must up load 5 pictures of their finished project. With the exception of the 5th photo, all photos must be close range, taken straight on (not above or below subject) with no filter.

- 1. Front view
- 2. Right side
- 3. Left side
- 4. Back

Ring lights and backgrounds may be used but no editorial aids are permitted.

Intermediate Hairstyling Objective - Creative Bridal

- 1. 75% of the hair is incorporated into an up-style yes 5 pts no 0 pts
- 2. In category: Wearable Not fantasy -- yes 5 pts no 0 pts
- 3. Contains at least two textures - yes 5 pts no 0 pts

DEMERITS WILL BE GIVEN FOR ANY RULE INFRACTIONS INCLUDING:

- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- All product labels must be covered
- All contestants must have closed toed shoes
- Professional sanitary practices must be followed
- Industry safety protocols must be followed
- No platform or high heel shoes
- No hair fillers, pads, builders or nets
- No temporary color added
- No touching the hair after the time is up
- Mannequin dressing must occur during the allotted time frame.
- Sound must be on during recording
- Any outside communication verbal or otherwise with the competitor during the competition times will be seen as coaching and will cause demerits to be awarded and possible illumination from competition.
- Competitors are urged to create a clean finish and may remove (with cutting implements or tweezers) hair that deemed to interfere with a clean finish (broken pieces that stick up) **however** removal of excess length or bulk from the hair will result in demerits
- Mannequins are considered to represent live customers and should be treated as such. Do not fasten with pins or glue etc. Using unrealistic and unprofessional means to secure hair or ornamentation will result in demerits.

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

In the case of a tie the RTC Chair, RTC Co-Chair and Head Judge will re-judge the tied submissions.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENT

Clean, comfortable, protective work attire as would be worn in a modern hair salon. No competitor will be allowed to compete without closed toed shoes.
