ACCEPTED FILE TYPE: pdf, doc, docx, xls, xlsx, csv, txt, rtf, html, zip, mp3, wma, mpg, flv, avi, jpg, jpeg, png, gif. If you would like to submit a different type of file, please place it in a zip folder.

To create a zip file – Select all the files that you would like to submit and right-click your mouse, a menu will open, select Send To, and then click on Compressed (zipped) folder. A zip file will then be created containing your submission documents.

Submissions will be due within 15 minutes of the end of competition time. Please note: Late submissions sent after the date and time specified above will not be accepted.

SAFETY:

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

The contest will cover the theoretical and practical aspects of current state of the art electronic industry standards. The competitor may be asked to demonstrate abilities in the following areas:

- Interpret electronic schematic diagrams, pictorials, manufacturers technical specifications and suppliers' catalogues.

- Identify common electrical and electronic components.
- Construct, analyze and troubleshoot DC circuits.
- Construct, analyze and troubleshoot circuits which may include integrated circuits (ICs) such as logic gates, operational amplifiers, timers, and other TTL or CMOS components.
- Apply the appropriate test procedures and equipment to a given situation.
- Interpret the observed values from the test equipment (voltages, currents, waveforms and circuit resistance).
- Answer questions related to basic electrical/electronic theory.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Actual project details will be released the morning of the competition.

Tasks that may be performed during the contest:

- Part 1 – Theory: Multiple Choice and Numerical Response Quiz
- Part 2 – Breadboarding: Reverse engineer the schematic diagram from an image of a breadboarded circuit
- Part 3 – Measurement & Analysis: Construct circuit in MultiSim Live. Measure voltage and current using MultiSim Live measurement tools and answer circuit analysis questions based on those measurements
- Part 4 – Soldering: Assemble a circuit on a provided PCB using through-hole components

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Part 1 - Theory: Photo or scan of quiz answers
- Part 2 – Breadboarding: Photo or scan of schematic diagram
- Part 3 - Measurement: Photo or scan of measurements and analysis answers
- Part 4 - Soldering: Shipped for judging

SHIPPING FINAL PROJECT FOR JUDGING:

Competitors will be required to ship their finished project for judging. Skills Canada Alberta will provide return packaging and pre-paid return shipping labels. Competitors will be required to ship their projects within 24 hours after the competition.

- Solder Iron suitable for use with no-lead solder types. Stand, Tip cleaner, tips of choice. Butane solder devices will not be allowed.
- De-Soldering tool (Braid or Hand vacuum solder extractor)
- Brush for cleaning solder project. No solvents allowed to clean boards.
- Fume Extractor/ Exhaust Fan
- Digital multimeter
- Long nose pliers
- Side Cutters
- Wire Stripper
- Screwdrivers (including precision set)
- “Third Hand” including magnifying glass. (optional)
- Magnifier (Optional)
- Power bar
- Safety Glasses
- Pens, Pencils, Eraser, Ruler
- Stand-alone calculator (non-programmable i.e. TI-30Xa)

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TIE BREAKING PROCESS

In the case of a tie, the winner will be decided by the highest score in the Breadboarding category. If there is still a tie, the winner will be decided by the highest score in the Soldering category.
