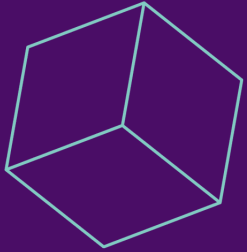

2023 PROVINCIAL SKILLS CANADA COMPETITION—MAY 3—4, 2023



Congratulations on being selected to compete in the 31st Provincial Skills Canada Competition!

The Provincial Skills Canada Competition (PSCC) is Skills Canada Alberta's cornerstone event which showcases the exceptional talents of students studying skilled trades and technologies. This event provides spectators the ability to watch Alberta's brightest challenge themselves in one of the 45 skill areas in a two-day Olympic-style competition. This event not only showcases students but serves as a critical link between education, employers, labour groups, and government to demonstrate that trade and technical careers are exciting and challenging opportunities.

Competing at the PSCC will provide you with unique training opportunities and demonstrate to future employers that you have the dedication and skill set to participate in a high-level competition.

PSCC Gold Medalists can continue their skills journey to compete at the 2023 Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC) in **Winnipeg, MB** from **May 23—27, 2023**.

Eligibility Criteria:

- **Non-Apprenticeable Skills:** A competitor must be registered student with a training institution in a related program in a competition area in which they wish to compete at any time between July 1st of the previous year of the PSCC and the start of the PSCC.

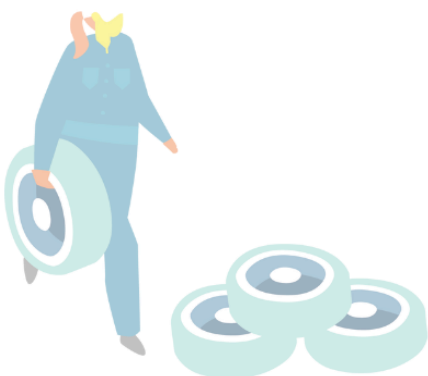
Apprenticeable Skills: A competitor must be registered student with a training institution in a related program, pre-apprenticeship program or be a registered apprentice in the trade (skill) in which they wish to compete at any time between July 1st of the previous year of the PSCC and the start date of the PSCC.

AND

- Competitors cannot be a certified journey person prior to May 1, 2023, in the skill area in which they wish to compete
- Must be born on or after January 1, 2002
Except for competitors in **Aerospace Technology, Mechatronics** or **event areas that do not move forward on Team Alberta or on Team Canada to WorldSkills** must be born on or after January 1, 1999. Please review the following list of events to confirm competition area progression and age limit.
- Must be an Alberta resident
- Must be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada

All Post-Secondary Competitors should ensure they have support from their employer to attend the PSCC and SCNC as some days of work will be missed.

The cost for a post-secondary competitor to attend the PSCC and SCNC is typically covered by most post-secondary institutes. For additional information regarding fees, please contact Javiera javierad@skillsalberta.com

1) Apply online before April 1, 2023 | skillsalberta.com/post-secondary-competition-application

Endorsement from an instructor or technical/training institute is required. Successful applicants will receive notification from Skills Canada Alberta confirming their spot.

Review the Contest Description and Prepare for your competition | skillsalberta.com/eventlist

Contest descriptions outline the project, skills and knowledge that will be tested, required equipment and materials, safety requirements, and judging criteria. Students who do not comply with the safety equipment requirements outlined in the contest description will not be permitted to compete. Contest descriptions will be posted by January 31, 2023, and recommend checking for any updates or changes prior to the competition.

Important Note: Alberta Apprenticeship & Industry Training supports participation in SCA programs. Participation in the PSCC and SCNC is considered an excusable absence, and approved missed days will not result in termination from technical training. You are responsible for the material covered during your absence and you will be required to complete any missed assignments or examinations. Please notify your instructors that you are competing to assist you with training and keep you informed of missed course work.

Compete at the 2023 Provincial Skills Canada Competition | May 3 –4, 2023

The 31st PSCC will be held at the Edmonton Expo Centre and is open to the public.

Attend the Opening Ceremony and Registration | Tuesday May 2, 2023. Competitor registration immediately follows the Opening Ceremonies. Some competitions will have a mandatory orientation directly after registration; please review your contest description to see if when your orientation will be held. Competitors unable to attend can register on Wednesday May 3, 2023 starting at 7:00 am.

Attend the Awards Ceremony | Thursday, May 4, 2023. The gold, silver and bronze medalists will be announced, and Team Alberta is selected. Bring your friends and family to cheer you on!

28th Skills Canada National Competition Winnipeg, MB | May 23—27, 2023

Gold medalists from the 2023 PSCC qualify for Team Alberta to compete at the Skills Canada National Competition. You will be asked to confirm your participation for Nationals at the PSCC Awards Ceremony. **You must attend the PSCC Awards Ceremony to claim your Team Alberta spot.** If you are unable to attend the ceremony but would like to be on Team Alberta, you must send an email confirming your intention to compete at Nationals to javierad@skillsalberta.com, otherwise we will offer the position to the silver medalist.

47th WorldSkills Competition

Lyon, France | September 2024

2023 is the qualifying year for WorldSkills Lyon, France we want to take you!

You must be born on or after January 1, 2002 to be eligible to compete in Lyon (with the exception of January 1, 1999 for Aerospace Technology and Mechatronics). You must qualify for Team Alberta at the 2023 PSCC in order to compete at the 2023 Skills Canada National Competition, where the top two age-eligible prospects are selected to contend for their spot on Team Canada to move onto WorldSkills Lyon.

The WorldSkills Competition occurs every two years and is the world's largest showcase of vocational education and skills excellence. Competitors representing 65 member countries and regions will compete in 85 skill areas. They will demonstrate their exceptional talents gained through years of training and dedication to complete their highly specialized technical challenges.

Qualifying for Team Canada is a once in a lifetime experience! As a national champion, you will have access to thousands of dollars in scholarships and training opportunities, give you international competition and travel opportunities, and allow you to work side-by-side with Canada's finest trainers and experts!
