- Ability to complete an assignment within a specified time frame.








PROJECT DESCRIPTION

SAFETY

The health, safety and welfare of all individuals involved with Skills Canada Alberta are of vital importance. Safety is a condition of participation with Skills Canada Alberta and shall not be sacrificed for the sake of expediency. At the discretion of the judges and technical committees, any competitor can be denied the right to participate should they not have the required proper safety equipment and/or act in an unsafe manner that can cause harm to themselves or others.

It is important that competitors present a professional image and appearance. Appropriate work clothing must be worn to compete. All clothing must be neat and clean and free of rips and tears. Casual wear such as shorts will not be permitted. No loose fitting clothes or jewelry.

Safety Requirements: MANDATORY

- CSA approved footwear green triangle standard (Competitor)
- CSA approved hard hat (Provided by Committee)
- CSA approved safety glasses (Provided by Committee) However, prescription glasses must conform to CSA regulations.
- CSA approved hearing protection (Provided by Committee)
- Suitable work clothing (Competitor)
- Competitors are required to follow all industry safety standards during the competition.

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

If two or more participants are tied in points at the end of the competition, the following tie breaking procedure will be used:

- **Step 1.** Participant with the highest Safety score.
- **Step 2.** Participant who has completed the project in the least amount of time.
- **Step 3.** Re-evaluate the projects with different judges.
