CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Competitors will be able to evaluate their proficiency and creative use of aperture, shutter speed and ISO. Competitors will demonstrate how combinations of these three elements give very different results. The photography competition will focus on a high-level end product.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- Shutter Speed, Aperture, ISO, Focal Length
- Composition
- Post Production/Workflow

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- Competitors will take 3 well composed, correctly exposed photographs designed around a given theme.
- The project's theme is #NW Skills Pride with the GPRC Fairview Campus, and any of the 2020 Competition locations. Submit 3 photographs showcasing what you think makes the NW





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Regional Skills great!

- Help menus may be accessed and google searches may be performed to assist with editing photos
- No use of Adobe Photoshop Pre-sets are allowed
- Adding elements to your images and combining photographs is NOT ALLOWED
- A digital copy of each color jpeg as well as RAW digital photo (saved to USB memory stick) will be collected for printing. Prints will then be mounted for presentation by competitors

Please note: Competitors may be granted access to Skills Competition areas ONLY if permission from the Committee Chair of that specific competition allows it. If granted access, competitors MUST be outfitted in the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment for that particular area.

EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

Equipment and Materials Competitors Must Supply:

- DSLR camera and any other camera related equipment i.e. card reader, cables, battery chargers, lenses, memory cards etc.
- Tripods(optional)
- Speedlight or other lighting modifiers (optional)
- Competitors may bring their own computer (Please advise of your decision to Tech Committee)

Equipment and Materials Supplied by the Committee:

- Computers with Adobe Photoshop and or Light room
- Memory sticks
- Mounting boards and materials
- Card Readers

JUDGING CRITERIA

- Impact
- Effective Composition
- Techniques (E.g. Lighting, Posing)
- Professional Presentation (E.G. Retouching, Mounting)

TIE BREAKING PROCESS (NO TIES ARE ALLOWED)

In the event of a tie, the judges will re-evaluate the over view of the 3 photographs. The competitor with the best 3 photos will be declared the winner.
