SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

- Applying mathematical concepts involving 45° offsets in a piping system
- Interpreting and applying the blueprint specifications and managing material usage
- Assembling of various piping systems
- Assembly of pipe and fittings
 - Steel Threaded and Press Connect
 - Copper Soft Soldering, compression, and Press Connect
 - Plastic Pipe ABS solvent cement
- Bending of copper tube using mechanical benders. (RIDGID model 310/316m cat. # 36962)
- Apply safe work practices
