CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Purpose of the Challenge:

The principal function of an aesthetician is to give beauty care to persons with the main purpose of improving their appearance as well as giving the people physical and psychological well-being. By general means, the essential part of this work is to treat different parts of the body including specific care to facial skin, specific care for the hands, specific care of the body, and the application of makeup, while demonstrating professionalism and complying with occupational health and safety.

Tasks that will be performed during the contest:

• Manicure with Nail Art:

- Objectives: On artificial nails (tips) competitor will demonstrate French gel polish (cleanup/correction allowed) on 8 nails and nail art on 2 nails. The design theme (France) will be complimented with a kit that will contain the following gems, foil, glitter/pigment, gel polishes
- O The competitor will also perform a dry manicure which includes nail shaping, cuticle work, and massage to the hand only. Once finished the competitor will apply the nail art (tips) with glue dots to the nails of the human model.

Note: Sponsors TBD

Note: Nail art must be free handed using only the nail art supplies provided by the Sponsor. Decals, polish with built in striper brush, corrector pens, guideline tape, or any other tool will not be allowed. Nail art brushes may not be adjusted in any way.

• Back Treatment & Reflexology of the Feet

- o Objectives: The competitor must demonstrate a back treatment on human model
- o Cleanse, tone, exfoliate using BT Micro machine (ultra-sonic spatula), massage, mask and finishing products.
- o Demonstration of reflexology on the foot using the provided video.

Evening Makeup with Design Element

- o Objectives: Demonstration of evening makeup using competitors' products.
- o Foundation, correction, highlight/contour, blush, shadow, lip liner, eyeliner, mascara, lip stick and artificial strip lashes.
- o The makeup steps will be provided and will include one design element.
- o Competitors will build on the design element to create a design of their choice.

Note: Design element must be completed "free hand" using only the listed supplies. No stencils may be used in completing the design.

Mini Facial with Brow Lamination & Tint, and Lash Lift & Tint

Objectives: The competitor will demonstrate a Skin analysis and model consult with findings recorded on provided sheets.









- O Cleanse using the BT Micro machine (ultra-sonic spatula with silicone attachment), tone, exfoliate, serum, mask and finish using the sponsor's products (TBD).
- o Lash tint and lift using sponsor's products (TBD).
- o Brow tint and lamination using sponsor's products (TBD)

Note: It is the candidate's responsibility to prepare for the competition by becoming familiar with the products and machines to be used during the competition.

COMPETITORS WILL BE REQUIRED TO USE THE MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT PROVIDED BY SCC. ALL OTHER MATERIAL AND EQUIPMENT WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE SKILL AREA.

Required clothing provided by the competitor.

Uniform (see test project) no leggings or yoga pant styles allowed, all black.

Black non-slip, flat or low heel, closed toed shoes with no laces.

Black socks above the ankle must be worn.

No jewelry which may interfere with the task being performed or place the model or aesthetician at risk.

Hair must be tidy and tied back, off the collar and face.

Competitor must have short, natural nails. No nail extensions, or recent removal of. No nail varnish or coverings.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

Safety workshop

Upon arrival at the Skill area, Competitors will participate in a Safety workshop, and they will be expected to work and maintain a safe working area during the competition. Any Competitor breaking any health, safety and environmental rules, may be required to undertake a second safety workshop, this will not affect the Competitor's competition time.

TOPIC/TASK	CONTEST SPECIFIC RULE
Infrastructure	Competitors are not allowed to bring or use facial sponges Competitors must get approval from the Provincial Technical Committee to bring any other equipment or material that is not listed on point 4.2. Please contact Skills Alberta for approval.
Projects	Competitors are allowed to make corrections during polishing for Manicure with Nail Art project. PTC can change a maximum of 30% of the work content at the competition.

Ties

- Tiebreaker #1: In the event of a tie, the candidate with the highest score in the Advanced Facial criteria will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #2: In the event of second tie, the competitor with the highest score in the Body Therapy Treatment criteria will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #3: If a tie remains, the competitor with the highest score in the Creative Makeup criteria will be declared the winner.

Where the Test Project has been circulated to Competitors in advance, PTC shall change a maximum of 30% of the work content. Please refer to the Competition Rules.
