CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Purpose of the Challenge:

The principal function of an aesthetician is to give beauty care to persons with the main purpose of improving their appearance as well as giving the people physical and psychological well-being. By general means, the essential part of this work is to treat different parts of the body including specific care to facial skin, specific care for the hands, specific care of the body, and the application of makeup, while demonstrating professionalism and complying with occupational health and safety.

Tasks That Will Be Performed During the Contest:

Manicure: Seasonal Fusion

During the Seasonal Creative Manicure, competitors will showcase their skills by performing a dry gel polish spa manicure, which includes shaping the natural nail and performing cuticle work. They will also apply an exfoliation treatment and a mask and demonstrate a comprehensive 12-step hand and arm massage. Detailed instructions for this massage procedure will be available on the Skills Alberta website for reference.

Competitors are required to apply a bold red gel polish to nine fingers, leaving one ring finger unpolished. On this ring finger, they will create a hand-painted nail art representation of one of the seasons—spring, summer, autumn, or winter—without any three-dimensional decorations. The design will continue from the ring finger, across the back of the hand, and along the forearm up to the elbow, using any chosen art medium. All artwork must be hand painted and free from any embellishments. Competitors are responsible for supplying their own tools and materials for the freehand nail and arm design.

Body Therapy Treatment

Competitors will perform a manual leg and foot exfoliation from the knee down, including the entire foot followed by a mud detoxification wrap to the exfoliated area finishing with a lotion.

During the detox wrap, competitors will perform a pressure point head massage (<u>found here</u>) followed by a jade comb head massage (<u>found here</u>).

Competitors will then complete a dry (no soaking) mini pedicure on a lay down bed which will include toenail trimming, filing, and cuticle work with a French lacquer polish (base coat, white French application that compliments the toenail shape, blush pink overlay, topcoat). Corrections are permitted. Polishes to be supplied (L'Moor & Pro Beauty Group).

Creative Makeup: Seasonal Fusion

In the seasonal fusion creative makeup challenge, competitors will use their own makeup and tools to create a unique design. The task is to blend the essence of two chosen seasons onto the face and décolleté, with equal representation of each season (50/50 split). Competitors may choose any two seasons for their design.

Judging will focus on creativity, technical skill, color harmony, theme representation, and overall impact. Competitors should aim to create a memorable fusion of two seasons, using two accessories to enhance their design.

Advanced Facial

The competitor will showcase an advanced facial routine, featuring the application of cleanser, exfoliant, serum(s), mask and finishing products.

The facial treatment will utilize equipment such as the BT Sonic for cleansing (<u>link to video found here</u>) and BT Micro for product infusion and cold globes (<u>link to video found here</u>).

Participants will demonstrate lymphatic drainage techniques on the face, followed by a relaxing massage covering the face, neck décolleté and neck & shoulders.

- No jewelry which may interfere with the task being performed or place the model or aesthetician at risk
- Hair must be tidy and tied back, off the collar and face
- Competitor must have short, natural nails. No nail extensions, or recent removal of.
- No nail varnish or coverings.

Upon arrival at the Skill area, Competitors will participate in a Safety workshop, and they will be expected to work and maintain a safe working area during the competition. Any Competitor breaking

any health, safety and environmental rules, may be required to undertake a second safety workshop, this will not affect the Competitor's competition time.

Infrastructure	-Competitors are not allowed to bring or use facial sponges -Competitors must get approval from the Provincial Technical Committee to bring any other equipment or material that is not listed. Please contact Skills Alberta for approval.
Projects	Competitors are allowed to make corrections during polishing for Manicure with Nail Art project. PTC can change a maximum of 30% of the work content at the competition.

Tiebreaker

- Tiebreaker #1: In the event of a tie, the candidate with the highest score in the Advanced Facial criteria will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #2: In the event of second tie, the competitor with the highest score in the Body Therapy Treatment criteria will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #3: If a tie remains, the competitor with the highest score in the Creative Makeup criteria will be declared the winner.
