CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Enable industry as well as observers to view the level of skill taught within the secondary and post-secondary programs and encourage interaction between the various sectors. This relationship will ensure the skills gained by young hairstylists at all levels of training will meet the demands of the beauty industry. The competition also challenges students in hairstyling and promotes this career area.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

This competition will be a **photo replication** very typical of what a client would ask for in a salon. This look will be **commercial/wearable**. The level of this competition will allow the young stylists to demonstrate their technical skills and creative design ability in the following test by creating a Bridal Style (Long Hair) Evening. *NO ornamentation will be allowed at the Regional level but* will be provided at the Provincial competition.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION Ladies' Hairstyling Bridal Style

Duration: 1.5 Hours

Test: Bridal Style: Must be Commercial and Wearable

A photo (one of the three below) from a sealed envelope will be revealed live at during the orientation. Students will not have a chance to confer with coaches or others before the start of the competition. Each student will receive a copy of the photo they are expected to replicate at the orientation and will put it onto their station so they can reference it during the competition.





There will be NO:

- Clothing or jewelry
- Ornamentation (only provided at Provincials)
- No temporary color including but not limited to chalk, glitter, and mascara

Objective:

- The competitor will re-create the revealed up-style from the photo.
- The style will be acceptable for a typical bridal client to wear & will not be fantasy.
- The competitors will handle hair confidently and will brush, comb, and part hair correctly to duplicate the elements of the photo.
- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- No curls, waves, or shapes can be incorporated before the start of competition.
- There will be NO braiding in this event.

JUDGING CRITERIA

All judging will be performed according to both subjective and objective criteria. Objective areas are those areas that are a simple yes or no. Subjective areas are those which require trade-specific creative judgment.

- Subjective areas are judged by an independent panel and include the following five areas:
 - 1. Replication of Photo
 - 2. Quality of Design
 - 3. Balance of Design
 - 4. Clean Finish
 - 5. Harmony from every view angle

Objective areas judged by the Regional Technical Committee or similar Judging Panel include:

- 1. In category: Commercial look
- 2. Contains the elements in the photo
- 3. Appropriate use of the accessories provided (at the Provincial competition)

DEMERITS WILL BE GIVEN FOR ANY RULE INFRACTIONS INCLUDING:

- Mannequins will be displayed on the table facing the mirror with a regular stand (no tripods).
- There are no additional props on the display surface.
- No ornamentation will be used at regionals but an ornamentation will be provided at provincials.
- There is to be no dressing of the mannequin (clothing, accessories).
- Students are only allowed to bring one mannequin onto the competition floor (no choosing mannequins after the photo has been shared)
- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- All product labels must be covered.
- All contestants must have closed-toed shoes.
- Professional sanitary practices must be followed.
- Industry safety protocols must be followed.
- No platform or high-heeled shoes.
- No hair fillers, pads, builders, or nets.
- No temporary). Color can be added.
- No touching the hair after the time has been called.

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- Only 1 appliance is to be plugged in at any given time.
- No headsets or portable music devices are allowed.
- Any communication between the audience and competitor during the competition times will be seen as coaching and will result in demerits.
- Competitors are urged to create a clean finish and may remove hair that is deemed to interfere with a clean finish using shears only. Removal of excess length or bulk from the hair will result in demerits.

TIE-BREAKING PROCESS

In the case of a tie, judges will be called back to the competition floor to break the tie.
