Every 2 years, the **WorldSkills Competition** represents the very best of international excellence in skilled trades and technologies. In May 2025, the Skills Canada National Competition was a qualifying year for WorldSkills to be held in Shanghai, China on September 22-27, 2026. Skills Competences Canada brings a team of 31 competitors who are selected based on the results of the Skills Canada National Competition.

Traditionally, Alberta does very well, and this past competition was no different. Of the 31 competitors on Team Canada, more than one third will be represented by 12 Alberta competitors. This is a record year for Team Alberta participants moving on to WorldSkills and we could not be prouder. The following competitors from Alberta will represent Canada on the world stage:


These competitors represent the best of their peers and have earned a spot on Team Canada through dedication and hard work. At the WorldSkills Competition in Shanghai, competitors will participate in trade and technology skill challenges over four days and will be judged against international quality standards.


Alberta has performed well on the Worlds stage with the most recent successes of Ben Rainforth receiving a bronze medal at WorldSkills Lyon, France in 2024, and Koree Nottveit receiving a gold medal in Cooking at the WorldSkills Special Edition Competition held in Switzerland in 2022.

Since its inception, Skills Canada Alberta competitors have received 2 Gold, 1 Silver, 2 Bronze medals, and 33 Medallions for Excellence, meaning they have reached a score well above what is considered average.

The reason for this success at the Worlds level is the investment Skills Canada Alberta makes in each competitor's training and preparation. We support competitors to have international training experiences to hone their skills and adjust to the physical and mental challenges of competing internationally. We ensure that their trainers can travel with competitors to provide meaningful support while competing. We also invest in mental preparation training sessions to help competitors overcome physiological barriers to achieve peak performance, and supply competitors with WorldSkills caliber tools and equipment for training and competition.

These high achieving competitors then become role models for Alberta youth to seek out careers in skilled trade and technologies. By having youth model excellence in skilled trades and technologies, Skills Canada Alberta can meet its mission to actively promote careers that are in high demand for Alberta industries.






PARTNERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES
