CONTEST INTRODUCTION

The project consists of practical work reflecting artistic and structural masonry elements of building construction. The materials may be brick, concrete block, glass block and/or natural stone. Decorative elements may include arches, all possible bonds, flat and/or curved walls, projecting and/or recessed units and non-dimensional cut stone. Theoretical knowledge is not tested but necessary to carry out the practical work on the project.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

- Measuring lengths
- Calculating and marking angles
- Determining layout and drawing interpretation and compliance with plans
- Cutting masonry material *Brick cutting (not including 90 degrees) to be limited to a maximum of 25% of the total numbers of bricks
- Leveling, plumbing and alignment
- Building corners







- Building walls of different bonds, materials and unit positions
- Building arch forms and arches
- Compliance with the plans
- Jointing; finish and accordance with plans
- Organization of workstation and general housekeeping

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project will challenge the competitor's ability to follow detailed plans, precisely lay out masonry walls, keep walls level and plumb, work cleanly and neatly as well as precisely cut and shape masonry units. The competitors may also be utilizing math and geometry skills to build arch forms.

Competitor Station

- Each competitor will have a working area of least 9 m2. The floor surface will be even (±5 mm and 2 m long), horizontal and have an adequate loading capacity. There will be sufficient space for delivery and storage of material.
- There will be a space of 1 m between public barrier and the competitor materials

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COMPETITION SPECIFIC RULES

The following Competition Specific rules along with SCA's overall Policies and Procedures provide specific details in competition areas that may vary from one another. Any additional contest rules will be reviewed during the Competitor Orientation.

Topic/Task	Contest Specific Rule
Use of Technology	Competitors are not allowed laptops, tablets, cameras, cell phones, ear buds, calculators or other personal electronics in the competition area unless specified by the committee for certain tasks.
Use of Artificial Intelligence (AI)	Competitors cannot use AI to develop/generate any of the submitted work for any aspects of the competition.

JUDGING CRITERIA

The project will be judged on the following criteria:

- Safety
- Overall appearance and neatness
- Completion time
- Alignment







- Level
- Plumb
- Jointing
- Dimensions and gauge
- Joint uniformity and finish
- Housekeeping and station cleanliness

Ties

- Tiebreaker #1: In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest score for Plumb (vertical alignment) criteria will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #2: If a second tie occurs, the competitor with the highest score in the Joint uniformity and finishing criteria will be declared the winner.
- Tiebreaker #3: If a third tie occurs the competitor with the highest score in the Detail criteria will be declared the winner.

CLOTHING REQUIREMENT

Appropriate work clothing must be worn to compete. All clothing must be neat and clean and free of rips and tears. Casual wear such as shorts, sweatpants, track pants and open toed shoes/sandals will not be permitted. No loose-fitting clothes or jewelry.

SAFETY

The health, safety and welfare of all individuals involved with Skills Canada Alberta are of vital importance. Safety is a condition of participation with Skills Canada Alberta and shall not be sacrificed for the sake of expediency. At the discretion of the judges and technical committees, any competitor can be denied the right to participate should they not have the required proper safety equipment and/or act in an unsafe manner that can cause harm to themselves or others.
