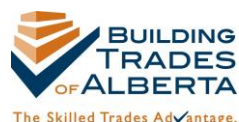

CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Joinery is the process of connecting or joining two or more pieces of wood together using various wood joints. In the timber frame industry joinery is part of the overall strength and construction of bents. In fine woodworking, common forms of joinery include dovetail joints, mortise-and-tenon joints, biscuit joints, lap joints, spline joints, etc. Joiners construct doors, windows, stairs and other architectural objects. Joinery involves work both by hand and machine.

Over the course of 2 days the participants will demonstrate their Joinery abilities in assembling a project. Each participant will receive a set of plans, a workspace, materials and related power tools to complete the task.





PLEASE NOTE**

Joinery is currently not an event at the Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC) and therefore the gold medalist of the Secondary Joinery Competition will not become part of Team Alberta and will not compete at the SCNC. Medals will be awarded during the Awards Ceremony on May 7th.

PURPOSE OF CHALLENGE

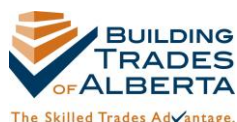
- To promote the hand skills needed to be successful as a fine woodworker.
- To evaluate each contestant's competency to organize and execute a given work assignment accurately and safely in the Joinery trade.
- To recognize outstanding excellence and professionalism.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- The ability to hand cut several joints such as:
 - Dovetails
 - Mortise and Tenon
- The ability to layout joints to be cut
- The ability to make and use a router template
- The ability to read plans and follow written and verbal instructions
- The ability to work safely and efficiently
- The ability to use the following power tools:
 - Cordless Drill
 - Drill Press
 - Orbital Sander
 - Miter Saw
 - Router Tables
 - Bandsaws
 - Plunge Router

CSA Approved Steel Toed Boots MUST be worn at all times in competition site.

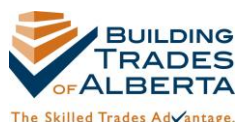
CLOTHING REQUIREMENT

Appropriate work clothing must be worn to compete. All clothing must be neat and clean and free of rips and tears. Casual wear such as shorts will not be permitted. No loose-fitting clothes or jewelry. CSA approved steel toed boots must be worn at all times (Note: Steel caps will not be provided).

SAFETY

The health, safety and welfare of all individuals involved with Skills Canada Alberta are of vital importance. Safety is a condition of participation with Skills Canada Alberta and shall not be sacrificed for the sake of expediency. At the discretion of the judges and technical committees, any competitor can be denied the right to participate should they not have the required proper safety equipment and/or act in an unsafe manner that can cause harm to themselves or others. Competitors, Judges, PTC members, and any person within the competition area, are required to wear and use all safety equipment, and follow all industry safety standards during the competition.

Competitors will not be allowed into the competition area without the required safety equipment.



Competition Specific Rules

The following Competition Specific rules along with SCA's overall Policies and Procedures provide specific details in competition areas that may vary from one another. Any additional contest rules will be reviewed during the Competitor Orientation.

Topic/Task	Contest Specific Rule
Use of Technology	Competitors are not allowed laptops, tablets, cameras, cell phones, ear buds, calculators or other personal electronics in the competition area unless specified by the committee for certain tasks.
Use of Artificial Intelligence (AI)	Competitors cannot use AI to develop/generate any of the submitted work for any aspects of the competition.
Use of Jigs/Aides	Competitors are not allowed to use commercial or pre-made jigs or aides, unless specified or approved by the committee.
Use of Powertools	Competitors are not allowed to use power tools other than those provided by the committee.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Competitors will be judged on the following:

- Demonstrate skills and competencies in interpreting plans and specifications
- Safety during project construction
- Proper selection and use of tools
- Ability to complete the project in specific time period
- General tidiness of work area
- Project coordination.
- Quality and accuracy

JUDGING CRITERIA

• Dimensions	30%
• Construction	40%
• Sale ability/Finishing	20%
• Safety/Cleanup/Material Usage	10%
Overall Total	100%

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

If two or more participants are tied in points at the end of the competition, the following shall apply to determine the placing:

- Step 1. Re-evaluate the effected projects with different judges.
- Step 2. Participant who has completed the project in the least amount of time.
- Step 3. Participant with the highest Safety score.

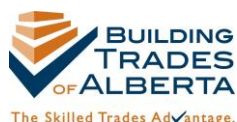
