CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Competitors will be required to demonstrate their knowledge and skills by completing a sample double welt pocket and a princess seam. Competitors will submit their finished products by mailing them in to be judged.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- Accuracy in sewing & cutting
- Ability to construct a welt pocket with clean corners and symmetrical points
- Use of Fusing
- Double welt construction
- Princess seam construction

Qualifying Skills Canada Competition

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Competitors must submit a sample Double Welt Pocket and sample Princess seam. The digital pattern provided (posted alongside this document) must be used for the Princess seam. The pattern must be printed on 11"x17" paper. No pattern is provided for the welt pocket. The length and width will be 1"X 5" for pocket opening. Welts must fill the opening and be symmetrical. Industry sewing standards for garment construction to be maintained as equipment allows.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- One sample Double Welt Pocket with Pocket Bag
- One Princess Seam sample (2 seams in sample, cut CF on Fold)
- Projects MUST be shipped overnight or priority shipping to be received no later than **4:00pm on March 6th, 2026**, to be considered for judging.

JUDGING CRITERIA

Appropriate Fabric selection
Pressing -Fusing
Welt construction including clean corners (welt)
Welt Symmetry - length and width
Pocket Bag
Bulk management (Clipping & Grading)
Accuracy in princess curve (No puckers and true to pattern shape)

TIE BREAKING PROCESS

- The sample with the cleanest corners will be put forward.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

We recognize that participants will be competing individually in their own unique environments and therefore not all competition conditions can be monitored. However, we expect all competitors to compete fairly, respecting and abiding by the established rules in the true spirit of Skills Canada Alberta.
