CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Competition Photography - Competitors will submit 1 photograph file online in digital format to the upload link that will be provided after registration commences. The submitted single photograph will have three panels/elements that contain distinct images and are thematically related. The theme of the competition is "The Bleu Hour". The images may or may not contain people. Images must be appropriate for display in a school setting. The overall size of the photograph must be an 8-inch X 10-inch print (2400 pixel by 3000 pixel) with a resolution of 300 dpi; however, the three panels/elements and their orientation within the layout are left to competitor interpretation. The maximum file size that will be accepted is 13 MB in JPEG (jpg) format. Please note, all digital files will be printed by Skills Canada Alberta once submitted digitally by the competitor and supplied to the judges for judging purposes.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED

- Composition eg: visual elements, style, balance and harmony, cropping
- Technical eg: focus, exposure, contrast, use of light
- Impact eg: overall impression of the photograph

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- 1 photograph with three panels/elements
- Each panel/element will be thematically related to the other two: theme of "The Bleu Hour"
- You are allowed to title the photograph (no descriptions, title only)
- If titled, the title must be located in the <u>bottom</u> right of the photograph and <u>must not</u> distract from the photography
- Competitors can shoot in any format they choose but must submit in a jpeg. The final photograph must be 3000 pixels on the long edge, and 300 dpi.
