CONTEST INTRODUCTION

Enable industry as well as observers to view the level of skill taught within the secondary and post-secondary programs and encourages interaction between the various sectors. This relationship will ensure the skills gained by young hairstylists at all levels of training will meet the demands of the beauty industry. The competition also challenges students in hairstyling and promotes this career area.

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED:

This competition will be a **photo replication** very typical of what a client would ask for in a salon. This look will be **commercial/wearable**. The level of this competition will allow the young stylists to demonstrate their technical skills and creative design ability in the following test by creating a Bridal Style (Long Hair) Evening. **NO ornamentation will be allowed at the Regional level but will be provided at the Provincial competition.**

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Test: Bridal Style: Must be Commercial and Wearable

A photo (one of the three below) from a sealed envelope will be revealed live during the orientation. Students will not have a chance to confer with coaches or others before the start of the competition. Each student will receive a copy of the photo they are expected to replicate at the orientation and will put it onto their station so they can reference it during the competition.



There will be NO:

- Clothing or jewelry
- Ornamentation (only provided at Provincials)
- No temporary color including but not limited to chinks, glitter, and mascara

Objective:

- The competitor will re-create the revealed up-style from the photo.
- The style will be acceptable for a typical bridal client to wear & will not be fantasy.
- The competitors will handle hair confidently and will brush, comb and part hair correctly to duplicate the elements of the photo.
- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- No curls, waves or shapes can be incorporated prior to the start of competition.
- There will be NO braiding in this event.

EQUIPMENT & MATERIALS

Equipment and Materials Competitors Must Supply:

Long hair mannequin and stand – this stand must be able to fit onto a 2" thick table, NO TRIPOD STANDS ALLOWED , no body mannequins, shoulders allowed, no neon colors	Working tools and equipment, which should include the following: water bottle, towels, cape, all cutting implements, all thermal tools (flat irons, crimpers, curling irons) hair dryer (must not require more than 1800 watts)
Preferred types of styling products (ALL PRODUCT LABELS MUST BE COVERED)

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COMPETITION SPECIFIC RULES

The following Competition Specific rules along with SCA's overall Policies and Procedures provide specific details in competition areas that may vary from one another. Any additional contest rules will be reviewed during the Competitor Orientation.

Topic/Task	Contest Specific Rule
Time Limits	All work must be completed within the specified timeframe. Tools may be set up beforehand, but no hair manipulation may begin until the official start signal. Time will be announced at various intervals throughout the competition by members of the committee.
Authentic Practice	Stylists must treat the mannequin as they would a live client. No techniques, products, or fastening methods may be used that would be unsafe, inappropriate, or impossible to perform on an actual person.
Respectful Work Space	Competitors must maintain a clean, safe work area. All tools must be sanitized according to industry standards.



Products and Tools	Hair products must be professional-grade and safe for client use. No adhesives, glues, tapes, or non–hair-safe fastening methods. No sharing of tools or products with other competitors. All product labels must be covered.
Use of Technology	Competitors are not allowed smart watches, cell phones, ear buds, or other personal electronics in the competition area unless specified by the committee for certain tasks.
Assistive Notes	Competitors may not bring any written instructions, diagrams, step-by-step guides, or reference materials onto the competition floor. All work must be completed from memory and without external prompts.

JUDGING CRITERIA

All judging will be performed according to both subjective and objective criteria. Objective areas are those areas which are a simple yes or no. Subjective areas are those which require trade specific creative judgement. Subjective areas judged by an independent panel and included the following five areas:

1. Replication of Photo
2. Quality of Design
3. Balance of Design
4. Clean Finish
5. Harmony from every view angle

Objective areas judged by the Regional Technical Committee or similar Judging Panel include:

1. In category: Commercial look
2. Contains the elements in the photo
3. Appropriate use of the accessories provided (at the Provincial competition)

Demerits will be given for any rule infractions listed in the Contest Specific Rules section including:

- Mannequins will be displayed on the table facing the mirror with a regular stand (no tripods).
- No additional props on the display surface.
- Students are only allowed to bring one mannequin onto the competition floor (no choosing mannequins after the photo has been shared)
- Hair must be completely dry and brushed through at the beginning of the contest.
- All contestants must have closed toed shoes (No platform or high heel shoes).
- No hair fillers, pads, builders or nets.
- No temporary color can be added.
- No touching the hair after the time has been called.
- Only 1 appliance plugged in at any given time.
- Any communication between audience and competitor during the competition times will be seen as coaching and will result in demerits.
- Competitors are urged to create a clean finish and may remove hair that is deemed to interfere with a clean finish using shears only. Removal of excess length or bulk from the hair will result in demerits.
- No ornamentation will be used at regionals but an ornamentation will be provided at provincials.



TIE BREAKING PROCESS

In the case of a tie, judges will be called back to the competition floor to break the tie. The highest score in the quality of design category will be the deciding factor. If there is still a tie, the replication of photo score will be the next deciding factor.
